Administration

- Division consists of the Chief, the Major, and the Office of Professional Standards
- Responsible for:
 - Management and planning of the agency
 - Purchases and budgetary preparation
 - Policy development and implementation
 - Management of the State Certification initiatives
 - Receives and investigates complaints and commendations



Complaints

- Tyrone Police Department has a policy that dictates how we receive and investigate all complaints.
- Each complaint will be investigated; regardless of the manner in which we receive it
- In keeping with state certification standards, we review complaints quarterly and again annually to determine if there are any issues of concern with any officer;
- The department reviews audio/video tapes each month as well as citations issued to ensure that officers are complying with department policy and state law.
- We utilize early intervention software that alerts to potential issues.



Complaints Received and Investigated 2020-2023

- 2020 through 2023 year to date
 We received and investigated a total of 5 complaints
 - One was founded (discovered internally)
 - Four were unfounded



State Accreditation

- The Tyrone Police Department was awarded State Accreditation in 2018.
- Annually required to meet 141 standards across 9 different areas:
 - Role & Responsibility
 - Training
 - Organization & Management
 - Personnel
 - Legal

Patrol Statistics

In 2021, the Patrol Division responded to 5,357 calls for service and worked 200 accidents.

In 2022, the Patrol Division responded to 5,253 calls for service and worked 198 accidents.

In 2023, year to date, the Patrol Division responded to 4,069 calls for service and worked 158 accidents.



Training

- In addition to the state mandated 20 hours annually, our officers average 52.4 hours per year
- To include high liability areas such as:
 - Use of Force
 - Pursuit Driving
 - Judgement-based scenario training
 - De-escalation and Crisis Intervention Training (CIT)
 - Dealing with individuals with diminished capacity
