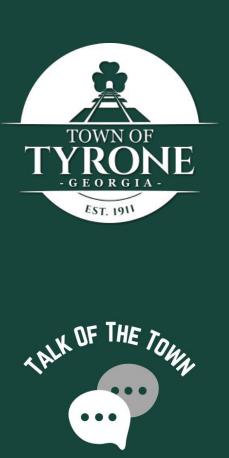

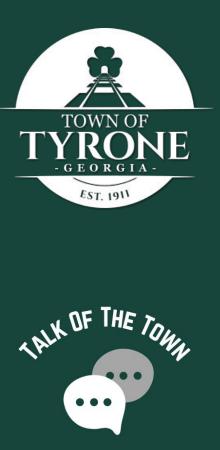

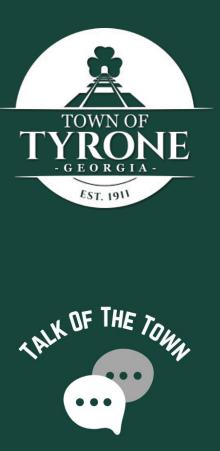

  - Fire Station Redevelopment

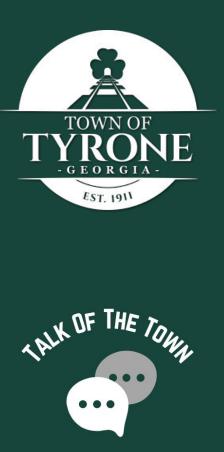

- The Town ALWAYS has multiple projects in the works ranging from small maintenance or improvements to a facility or equipment to major capital projects to include building new facilities or infrastructure.
- Capital projects: NEW projects with a cost of \$5,000 or more.

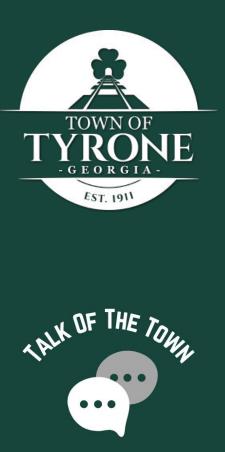

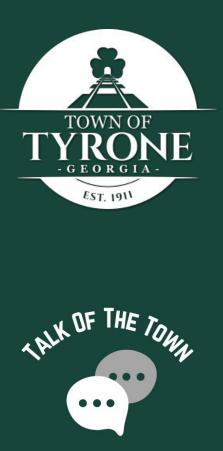

### **Information Session - Project Management**

#### • The Project Life Cycle

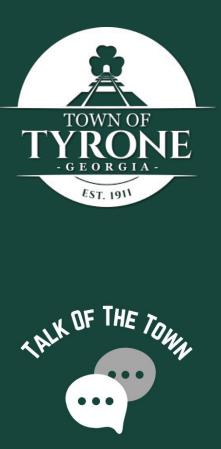
- Concept Where do project ideas come from?
  - Necessity repairs, improvements, etc.
  - Mandates ex: Pendleton Dam
  - Citizen Input cart paths, new playground, pickleball, etc.
  - Council Input
  - Staff Input (Observation/Training/Conferences/Networking)
  - Other Cities
- Internal Discussion Is it feasible? Projected costs? Is Council on board? How will it benefit the community?
- Budgeting/Sustainability where will the money come from? What are the long-term costs?



## **Information Session - Project Management**

#### • The Project Life Cycle Cont'd

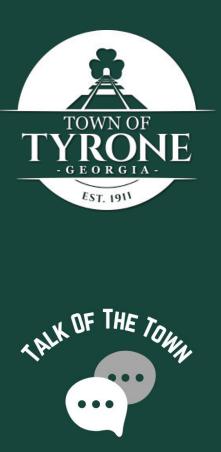
- Planning/Design nothing successful happens without a plan!
- Land Acquisition (Depending on the project) Sometimes the most time consuming!
- Procurement/Bidding We have to be good stewards of our funding!
- Award/Contracting
- Construction or Implementation
- Monitoring and Control
- Project Completion



#### **Information Session - Project Management**

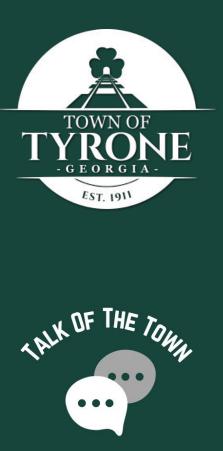
Some Projects Are Finished Faster Than Others!

- Common Factors That Can Delay A Project:
  - Workload/Staffing
  - Weather
  - Land Acquisition
  - Unforeseen Site Conditions
  - Budget/Funding Issues
  - Contractor Performance
  - Change Orders
  - Utility Coordination
  - Accidents, equipment failures, etc.
  - Material Shortages
  - Emergencies



## **Information Session - Project Management**

- Project Delay Examples:
  - Pickleball Project
    - Sub-grade concrete (~20 dump trucks of old concrete)
  - Tyrone Road MUP
    - Land acquisition (~ 1 year)
  - Pendleton Dam
    - Grant approval (applied 2019)
  - Palmetto Road Roundabout
    - Cost
    - Design started as a "mini" roundabout

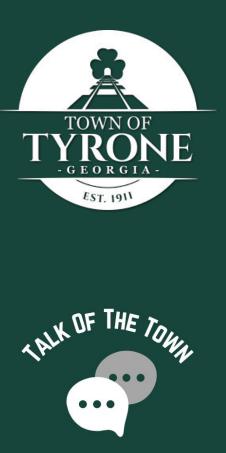


### **Information Session - Project Management**

#### • At the end of the day...

- We are constantly working on projects some are very visible, some not so much.
